



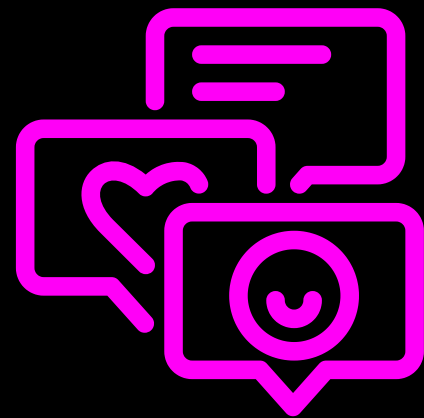
BECOMING AUTHENTIC

This kind of content is relatable and can be a source of encouragement and inspiration for others. It's also important to remember that we are not perfect and neither is our lives.



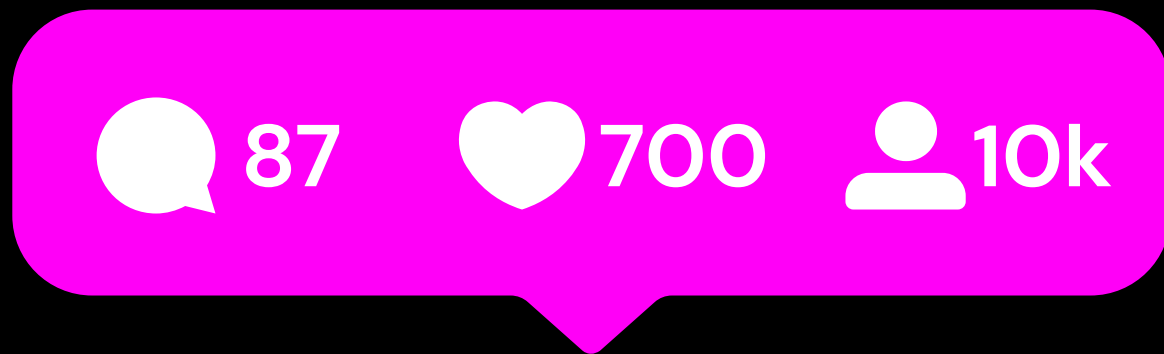
It's okay to share the messy and the not-so-perfect aspects of our lives.
